




45 NEW WELLS IN 2017!

Our drill team completed 45 wells using a rotary rig , providing clean water to 18,000 people!



275 HAND PUMPS INSPECTED

Our hand pump team visited 275 of the 350 water wells we manage. All but 4 were fully functional and scheduled for repair.

In 2011, our Water Wins Academy was founded when Hope Anzaku started to teach her own children and the children of other employees of our organization in the local Kamfani church. A few years later, the school had far out-grown the church building and so we built our current school. From day one, its purpose was to support the vision of Water Wins: Saving lives, saving souls. The school is a non-government, Christian school, but of course complies with all Nigerian laws. The Nigerian eduction system is organized slightly different than the American system: Students

start their education in Nursery, 1, 2 and 3. After Nursery, students go to Primary 1 through 6 which parallels our Elementary Schools here in the U.S. After graduating from Primary 6, students attend Junior Secondary School for three years and then Senior Secondary School for another three years. Both of these schools are similar to our Middle School and High School Programs. It is a very memorable event to go from 'Primary School' to 'Secondary School' and this year our Water Wins school graduated our very first class!

Water Wins Academy Current School Year

Our new school year just started! We are excited about the growth of our student population; and with that comes the growth of our team of teachers. Water Wins currently houses 3 Nursery classes and 6 primary classes (9 'grades') in this 5 classroom building. This means that almost every room is being used for 2 grades. And considering our 140+ students, during school hours this is a busy place! In Mahula, another village about 3 miles to the north of Kamfani, we have another school start-up, currently in a one-room building.

Student tuition is Naira 1,000 per period; there are 3 periods per year for a total of Naira 3,000 total per year. At the current exchange rate of about Naira 350 = US\$1, we charge roughly \$8.50 per student per year! The cost of teachers' wages per student is roughly \$60/year and the difference is bridged by donors. Even at \$8.50 per year, roughly 10% of our student population cannot afford this and we have a scholarship program for them. One of our donors has been supporting Blessing – a 14 year old girl in Primary 3. Her parents cannot afford the tuition. In addition, Blessing is from a traditional religion (animistic) family but she wants to be in the Christian school environment. Today, Blessing has accepted Jesus as her personal Savior and continues to learn in our Christian School.

Building Plans

Your donation helps us build bigger and better facilities that hold eager, bright minds

Now that we have Primary graduates, it is important that we can continue their education with Junior and Senior Secondary Schools. There is not sufficient land available in Kamfani to build a Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary School, so we have been looking in nearby villages. A family near the 1-room school building in Mahula, about 3 miles from Kamfani, donated 3½ acres of land, sufficient for the schools, dorms for our boarding students (we currently have about 30 boarding students in 3 over-crowded rooms), and apartments for our teachers! What a blessing!

We will continue to use the 5-room school in Kamfani as the Nursery and Primary school for the Village of Kamfani and surrounding area. We would like to expand our existing 1-room primary school in Mahula to become a full Nursery/Primary/ Secondary School, and Kamfani Primary would become a 'feeder' school to Mahula Secondary school. We plan to start more Primary schools in surrounding villages; after Primary graduation, all students will attend the Junior and Senior Secondary School in Mahula.

Our philosophy is to build 'simple' buildings: the common design in Nigeria of a 1-story building, made of mud blocks, tin roofs and nice verandas. However, we do want to use quality materials and make sure we use a craftsmanship approach to construction – buildings need to be able to survive a storm. Sounds common sense, but in our environment this needs to be emphasized.

Phase I of our building plan is to build 6 classrooms and 12 Teachers' quarters. We are planning on moving 2 Junior Secondary and upper Primary classes to the Mahula campus at beginning of school year 2018/2019. We expect to initially need 6 teachers' quarters and want to use the other 6 quarters for dormitories for our boarding students.

Phase II of the Mahula Campus building plan is to build the first 4 classrooms for the Primary school plus 3 labs for Senior Secondary school.

Phase III of the Mahula Campus building plan is to build an additional 5 classrooms for the Primary School, a principal's office and library, and additional teachers' quarters and dormitories. Also, an Exam Hall is a required building in the Nigerian School System.

The estimated cost for Phase I is roughly \$50,000. The first \$10,000 has been committed; but we do need an additional \$40,000 to fund this project.







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PREPARING CHILDREN FOR PRODUCTIVE SERVICE IN

GOD'S KINGDOM

Partners for Christian Empowerment Network (PCEN), the local Nigerian business development organization from Partners Worldwide, organized a 2-day Education workshop on August 2-3, 2017 in Makurdi, Benue State. The workshop brought together 16 Christian school leaders within and outside the PCEN network, including Water Wins Academy Head Teacher Hirra Adams, and was led by George Guichelaar, principal of South Christian High School in Grand Rapids, MI.

Thoughts from George on this event:

"Our plan was to present to the school leaders a foundation for critical thinking about worldview and the implications for their schools. The format of the meeting included a variety of group activities and a couple of heavy duty lectures. I experienced a fair bit of anxiety as I thought about presenting the process of engaging in a worldview conversation that depended on the interests, motivation, and desire of the participants. I also experienced some self-doubt about how they would respond to some rather hefty lecturing about world view and how it impacts school curriculum and how we teach it. Our intent is to help school leaders guide their schools to provide an educational model that prepares their students to think critically about how they view the world, what they believe, and commit themselves to a life of productive service.

After the first day of the event, my anxiety and self-doubt evaporated. The school leaders and teachers engaged and demonstrated a hunger for the worldview conversation. It should be noted that this was not an entirely new concept. They have been involved in Christian Education for many years developing sound philosophies of education and hunger for more. Not only did they engage in challenging conversation sharing insights, asking questions, sharing experiences and listening, but it also became apparent that this event was a significant networking opportunity for many who had not experienced such events."


