

BOARD MEMBER INTRO

This Newsletter we would like to introduce you to Moses Aende. Moses is a member of our Water Wins Board in Nigeria and his company Blessed Hope drills the rotary wells for Water Wins in the EKA. We are so thankful for his service to our project! We asked Moses to share a bit about himself and his hopes for the project:

Share a bit about where you grew up in Nigeria, your educational background, how God has impacted your life journey?

I was born of Tiv parents in the Middle Belt of Nigeria where I also grew up. I completed all early education in same area. I was fortunate to study Engineering at Nottingham University in England, UK on a Shell-BP Oil Development scholarship. When I returned to Nigeria I worked with Shell (1977-1982) and then with Benue Cement Co. (1983- 2003) until I retired. After retirement, I have been into engineering consultancy and construction including Water Engineering. In Benue State most people go to church, so I went. I grew up in church as my primary school was a Mission School. However, it was in 1979 that I had an encounter with the Lord Jesus Christ and surrendered my life to Him. Since then I have tried to live my life to please God and to use my workplaces as platforms to get people to know God through Jesus Christ.


How did you learn about Water Wins and what do you enjoy most about serving on the Board?

A friend who knows about my water borehole drilling had been talking to me about PCEN (Partners Worldwide program in Nigeria). One day he called me that he has visitors he wanted me to meet. He then came to my office with Mario Veldhuijzen and Jeremiah Yongo. They introduced me to Water Wins and its drilling issues to me. We had been associated with Living Water International who also uses water to reach communities with the Gospel. The vision of Water Wins was thus attractive to me. My joy on the Board is the hope of helping teams to use their various platforms for evangelism by modelling Christ and creating Christian communities.

What do you see as a key opportunity for Water Wins?

My hope is that with a good and appropriate foundation, Water Wins can create Christian communities in EKA that will enable the whole area to be reached for Christ.

ACADEMY UPDATES

The Academy has been working over the past few years to achieve government approval of our schools. This is a process that takes quite a bit of time and we are very thankful to have received provisional recognition from the government of our Primary School in Kamfani (128 students); we are still working on Junior Secondary in Mahula (42 students). This is a very important process for our school to be accredited.

We are excited that our new campus in Mahula is open for Junior Secondary. We are making preparations to add Senior Secondary in the near future. For accreditation purposes, we must have an exam room and laboratory for Senior Secondary so are planning how we can add those facilities soon to meet that requirement. Our outpost schools have 30 students enrolled this year! We are thankful for the nearly 225 students attending Water Wins Academy.
